## 2009 Season Preview

The Misericordia men's tennis team heads into its second varsity season in 2009, and they'll do it with eight underclassmen.

Six of the team's 10 current members are returnees from last season, including team captains **Matt Hopkins** and **Justin Muthler**. "Both of our captains were involved in starting the men's team last year," head coach **Allison Joanlanne** said. "We call them the pioneers of the team. They run everything down and never give up."

In its inaugural season, the team earned a 2-13 record that included wins over Immaculata and Baptist Bible.

After departing the Pennsylvania Athletic Conference, the Cougars will see tougher competition in 2009 in the Freedom Conference.

Returning from last season are: Hopkins and Muthler and sophomores **Kyle Capozzi**, **Brett Ford**, **Frank Nutt** and **Nate Powers**. Ford led the team in singles wins last season with an 8-6 record. He advanced to the PAC Semifinals in sixth singles. Hopkins and Muthler paired for a team-best 5-7 record in doubles. The duo qualified for the PAC Team Championships in second doubles.

The team's newcomers include freshmen **Matt Erney**, **Ryan Felsman**, **Fred Hockenbury** and **Mike Labagh**. "This is only our second year as a varsity team, and now we're in a new conference," Joanlanne said. "These guys look forward to the competition. They're very team-spirited."

The Cougars open the season at home on Sunday, March 15, versus St. Mary's (Md.).

**MISERICORDIA BELONGS TO NCAA, PAC, ECAC**

Misericordia University competes in the NCAA Division III, Pennsylvania Athletic Conference and Eastern College Athletic Conference.

Misericordia was a charter member of the PAC in 1992 and began PAC, ECAC and NCAA competition in September of that year.

After 16 years in the PAC, Misericordia will join the Middle Atlantic States Collegiate Athletics Corporation (MAC) beginning with the 2008-2009 season.

The PAC sponsors competition in 15 sports: men’s basketball, cross-country, tennis, soccer, baseball, lacrosse and golf; and women’s basketball, softball, cross-country, tennis, soccer, field hockey, volleyball and lacrosse.

With approximately 430 members and nearly 150,000 student-athletes competing annually, Division III is the largest of the NCAA’s three divisions.

Division III institutions place high priority on the overall quality of the educational experience and the successful completion of all students’ academic programs.

Formed in 1938, the ECAC is the nation’s largest athletic conference with more than 300 members in Divisions I, II and III from Maine to North Carolina.

**ATHLETIC FACILITIES**

The athletic facilities at Misericordia University are highlighted by the **Anderson Sports-Health Center** and the **Anderson Outdoor Athletic Complex**.

Since 1993, the **Anderson Center** has provided a home for the Cougars basketball, volleyball and swim teams.

The building houses the athletic department offices, campus health center and nursing, physical therapy and occupational therapy classrooms and laboratories.

The center features a six-lane swimming pool, indoor track, racquetball courts, fitness center and an aerobic/dance studio. The **Anderson Sports-Health Center** attracts more than 75,000 visitors annually for recreational use.

**Mangelsdorf Field** at the **Anderson Athletic Complex** was constructed in 2002 and serves as a home for the soccer, field hockey, lacrosse and track & field programs.

The complex features a synthetic grass field and a six-lane synthetic track which allow MU’s student-athletes to remain active even when weather conditions are less than ideal.

Named for the late **Dr. Robert S. and Geraldine Ruth Daley Anderson**, the **Anderson Sports-Health Center**, **Anderson Athletic Complex** and **Anderson Fields** are tributes to their commitment to Misericordia University.

**Mangelsdorf Field** honors the dedication of **Jack and Dorothy Mangelsdorf** to MU and the region.

Misericordia began women’s varsity tennis competition in 2004 at an on-campus complex that was part of a gift by the M&T Foundation. Men’s varsity tennis will be added in spring, 2008.

**MISERICORDIA UNIVERSITY IN BRIEF**

Misericordia University is a liberal arts based, co-educational Catholic institution serving both residential and commuting students.

The oldest four-year institution in Luzerne County, Misericordia made the transition to University status in August, 2007.

Founded by the Sisters of Mercy in 1924, Misericordia is one of 18 Mercy institutions in the United States.

Misericordia welcomes individuals from all faiths and offers a variety of liberal arts and professional programs at the undergraduate and graduate levels.

MU offers 30 majors in three academic colleges: Arts and Sciences; Health Sciences; and Professional Studies and Social Sciences.

The University is dedicated to the values of the Sisters of Mercy: mercy, service, justice and hospitality. These values can be found throughout the University, from programs of study to service projects.

The hallmark of MU is a dedicated faculty and a high quality core liberal arts and sciences curriculum. MU’s unique “Trinity of Learning” concept offers students an effective mix of quality academics, professional preparation and service leadership.

In addition to their diploma, MU graduates can participate in the school’s Guaranteed Placement Program. The GPP is a promise that, within six months of graduation, students will have a position in the career of their choice or be enrolled in graduate school, or the college will provide a paid internship in the student’s field of study.

With a total enrollment of 2,300 students, Misericordia offers the benefits of a small university with the scope of a larger institution.

Classroom size is purposefully small to ensure personalized attention and our 11:1 student/faculty ratio allows students and faculty to truly know one another. More than 84% of MU’s 93 full-time faculty hold a Ph.D. or other terminal degree.

In addition to academic pursuits, MU students participate in a wide range of athletic, recreational, spiritual, social and cultural activities with more than two dozen clubs organizations on campus.

MU sponsors 20 varsity sports including men’s soccer, cross country, basketball, swimming, golf, lacrosse, track & field, baseball and tennis; and women’s soccer, volleyball, field hockey, cross-country, tennis, basketball, swimming, softball, lacrosse, track & field and cheerleading.

Since the Pennsylvania Athletic Conference was formed in 1992, the Cougars have established themselves as a league leader with 29 PAC championships.

Misericordia made six PAC playoff appearances in 2006-07 and won PAC championships in men’s cross country, women’s soccer and softball. The women’s soccer team and softball team both qualified for the NCAA championships.

Located in Dallas, PA, MU’s 120-acre campus has a suburban atmosphere and is only nine miles from Wilkes-Barre and two hours from New York City and Philadelphia.



**DAVE MARTIN**  
Athletic Director

Dave Martin is in his fifth year as director of athletics at Misericordia University.

In his first four years, the Cougars won seven Pennsylvania Athletic Conference championships and earned five NCAA tournament berths.

In addition, he has guided the Cougars through the transition from the Pennsylvania Athletic Conference to the Middle Atlantic States Athletics Corporation (MAC). He has also overseen the addition of men’s tennis as a varsity sport offering at MU.

Martin previously spent 14 seasons as head men’s basketball coach at CM. He also served as associate athletic director and coordinator of athletic recruiting. He led the men’s basketball team to 11 Pennsylvania Athletic Conference playoff berths and two PAC finals appearances.

Martin compiled 178 career wins at MU and was a four-time PAC Coach of the Year.

A graduate of Wilkes University, Martin earned a master’s degree in education from Misericordia.



**ALLISON JOANLANNE**  
Head Coach

Allison Joanlanne is in her second season as men’s tennis coach at Misericordia University where she also coaches the women’s team.

Joanlanne led the women’s team to a 13-2 record and a berth in the Middle Atlantic Conference team championships. The team set a school record in wins. In four seasons, she has coached three players to individual PAC championships.

Joanlanne spent four years as a professional tennis instructor at the Premier Athletic Club in Cortland Manor, New York. She also worked as a tennis instructor for the Department of Parks and Recreation in New York City.

She holds a bachelor of science degree in sport management from Old Dominion University where she earned a tennis scholarship.

Joanlanne was named the Old Dominion team MVP and won a Sun Belt Conference Doubles championship.

She is a member of the United States Tennis Association and is certified as a Professional Tennis Registry Instructor.

Joanlanne is assisted by former Misericordia athletes **Amy Jayne** and **Ryan Calby**. Calby served as team captain last season.
